4. Election of new Chairman

AH explained that as he is moving to a new job and new area, he will be leaving as Chair of OH. AH thanked everyone for their commitment to OH and that OH was a fabulous group and an invaluable, fantastic resource for the town.

AH nominated Henry Wilson for the role of Chairman of ONE Haverhill, seconded by JB. HW will take up the post in September. The meeting thanked AH for his leadership.

AH left the meeting at 10.45am.

5. The Food Project

LE gave a slide presentation to the group.

LE highlighted that this was a three-year project, with a person undertaking LE's role in each district around Suffolk. The Food Project are working with local communities, organisations and groups, alongside existing, and will promote other available resources. The Food Project are working towards bringing services together and to connect with people.

HSF funding is due to end.

There is not a clear path to move forward.

The Food Project were in the process of making connections with local farmers and growers and were looking at the logistics of how food deliveries can be received by the group, it may be necessary to look at the possibility of a warehouse.

Although major supermarkets have improved their ordering processes, arising in less food waste, there surplus stock is still available.

A Q&A took place around the table, several ideas were discussed around the use of community kitchens, supermarket home deliveries and the Free Food project in Haverhill

Dr B outlined the need for education on the nutritional benefits of vegetables and that people need to be encouraged to move away from 'beige' food and that The Food Project, along with other groups, could assist people in accessing fresh vegetables.

DWP customers could benefit from advice and engagement with groups such as the food project, which may not then lead to them receiving sanctions.

There is a clear link between deprivation and criminality.

Eligibility for free school meals criteria is very low, around £7,000, those households with income over that amount would not qualify.

It was decided that a dedicated focus group be set up and that communications need to be kept open.

AH suggested a OH task group

Dr B suggested a Haverhill Food Festival.

6. Haverhill Science Festival

CP had circulated a report prior to the meeting and gave an overview of the event.

The aims and objectives were achieved to the best possible outcome. The feedback from schools was positive, there was excitement from children and teachers have rethought the school science syllabus. Thanks to West Suffolk Economic Growth Team who arranged the visit to Martlesham Heath.

Doing a Google search shows Haverhill stories.

Objectives were met; the 1,800 children invited from primary schools attended



At East Town Park the event felt busy but not over-crowded, with no long queues and good feedback was received.

As this was the first year, it was realised that there were long lead times when applying for grants, which meant that some deadlines were missed. If the event were to go ahead again, grant applications would need to be started earlier.

Discussion took place around the possibility of the holding the event again, sponsorship and grant funding. It was decided that the event should be held on a 2 yearly basis.

7. Mental Health and Wellbeing Sub-Group

SC: The Mental Health Action group is collaborating with other representatives and organisations to improve access to services and improve local mental health crisis support in Haverhill.

SC outline their six priorities:

- Increase Training for organisations and increase awareness in the community
- Develop a Haverhill Wellbeing Hub in Haverhill and explore the development of a community garden
- Establishing funding and sustainability
- Increase crisis support
- Increase children and young people's support
- Alleviate accessibility barriers

There is a good membership of local GP's.

Funding had been received from Suffolk County Council and MIND to design and publish a Wellbeing Passport, this was a first draft and a second would be produced. A copy was shown to members.

Working towards increasing collaboration with Open MIND, who are working in partnership with Haverhill Family Practice.

Working to provide a Welling being Hub, possibly at The Link

Planning an event 7th September.
